Alan Berkowitz is an independent consultant who helps colleges, universities, public health agencies and communities design programs that address health and social justice issues. The federal government and professional organizations frequently seek after Alan's expert opinion, and he is well known for scholarship and innovative programs that address issues of substance abuse, sexual assault, gender, and diversity. He is the Editor and founder of The Report on Social Norms. Dr. Berkowitz received the Ph.D. in Psychology from Cornell University in 1981 and is a New York State licensed Psychologist. He has received awards from a number of national organizations, including the "Outstanding Service Award".



*Steve Thompson*

Steve Thompson is one of America's leading experts on sexual assault, stalking, bullying and threat assessment. His unique approach is a result of over 30 years of research and street experience involving thousands of interviews with survivors and offenders. Thompson is an assault investigation consultant and criminal profiler for police officers throughout the USA. He is a court qualified expert witness and has consulted with many agencies and the media on some of the country's most public cases. Thompson is credited with researching and labeling date rapists the "Nice Guy" when he published the behavioral analysis of familiar sexual predators titled: "Date/Acquaintance Rape - The Crime and Criminal Profile".



*Carrie Giese*

Carrie L. Giese is the Sexual Violence Prevention and Education Coordinator at Oregon State University, where she also serves on the Oregon Attorney General's Sexual Assault Task Force and the Oregon University System Sexual Misconduct Prevention and Response Best Practices Conference Planning Team. Ms. Giese's work in sexual violence prevention was recognized in 2009 by being named an OSU Woman of Achievement and more recently the 2011-2012 OSU Exemplary Employee. Ms. Giese has provided training and lectures on sexual violence prevention and response on a national level since 2006.
